

On October 28, 2023, we will celebrate 26 graduates! This is our biggest graduating class yet. In honor of the hard work of our new alumni, we are holding a ceremony at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church at 10:30 am. We welcome our past alumni, current residents, staff, and community members to attend this event and take part in congratulating the women of Guest House.

This year's event will feature multiple speakers, including from our new Alumni Council (see page 4 for details). To add to the pomp and circumstance, we will host a musical perfomance, showcasing original works from our Doc Song project, a part of Promote Harmony, led by director Mimi Bornstein. These songs were written by some of this year's graduates and share their stories in a beautiful way.

As per tradition, all graduates will be presented with diplomas

and graduation regalia, a prayer blanket from our friends at Good Shepherd, flowers, and pearl earrings by the Kiwanis Club. The pearl earrings are a special Gift from Nugget Jewelers and Kiwanis Club to represent a challenge or difficulty- that transforms into something to be admired. We liken this to what our graduates have faced- they were faced with something intensely difficult, and they created something unique and beautiful.



The 2023 Graduates include women who have (or are scheduled to) completed both our Residential and Aftercare Programs successfully this calendar year. These women hail from all over Virginia, and range in age from 25 to 65. Here are a few milestones that illustrate the successes they've accomplished so far:

- Pursued Higher Education/ Professional Certificates.
- Leased their own apartment or found other stable housing.
- Found Reconnection with loved ones.
- Secured employment and/or got promoted at work.

ALUMNI COUNCIL IN FULL MOTION

In 2023, Friends of Guest House formed our first-ever Alumni Council. This effort affords our program alumni a leadership role within the organization as they identify opportunities for graduates to participate in Guest House's successful execution of its mission.

The Council's first Alumni Picnic was held in July with over 30 women in attendance. We have also elected our council officers, Terri Morton and Chasidy Deskins, as Co-Chairs. In addition to special events like our Alumni Picnic, our alumni have been hard at work establishing a strong relationship with the Arlington Community Federal Credit Union (ACFCU). They have cemented a speaker series on Financial Education to begin in the month of October. This series will include topics like Credit, Budgeting, and Credit Unions. These initial sessions will conclude with individual financial coach sessions for the participants.

In the coming year, we plan to host more of these trainings to empower all Guest House women.

THE NEED

At Friends of Guest House we provide reentry support that is both comprehensive and tailored to each woman's unique needs.

We do so by focusing on the "five pillars of livability": healthcare, employment, education, housing, and family/community reconnection.

Guest House is the **ONLY** group in Northern Virginia that provides 24/7 reentry support for women and is the largest reentry program in the state.



Friends and Family Day is the perfect example of our commitment to our livability pillar of "reconnection." For women in particular, family/community reconnection is one of the most important factors in successful reentry. Women who are reunited with their families, most notably their children, are less likely to return to prison. Friends of Guest House offers parenting classes so women can start to learn the tools and skills they will need to return to their children's lives. In addition, building a strong, supportive community helps women to succeed postincarceration.

Residents were able to reconnect with their loved ones, connect more with new friends, and reconnect with themselves in a fun and safe environment!
